From the Village President's Desk

Holiday Greetings Berkeley Residents and Business Owners

I hope that this correspondence finds you and your family doing well as we look to collectively and happily closeout the year 2020. Like many others, we anxiously welcome 2021 with the anticipation of great opportunities that are coming to the Berkeley community. Examples of these include the I-294 expansion project, School District 87 reconstruction of Sunnyside and MacArthur school buildings, the Berkeley Park District strategic plan as well as the Berkeley Public Library 5-year agenda for its planned growth within the community. We are certainly fortunate as Berkeley residents to have such forward thinking and positive planning management within our Schools, Park District and Public Library. The Village of Berkeley Board of Trustees is firmly committed to assisting our intergovernmental partners in any way that we can to help them achieve their goals, which is great for the entire community as well as our future successes.

The Village of Berkeley Board meeting of November 3rd featured our annual CAFR (Comprehensive Annual Financial Report) by the independent outside auditing firm of Sikich LLC. The Village received the positive news of completing the fiscal year of 2019-2020 with a budget surplus of \$60,000. I would like to thank and credit the entire Village of Berkeley management team led by Village Administrator Rudy Espiritu, Chief of Police Tim Larem, Fire Chief Mike Kuryla, Superintendent of Public Works Joe Wagner and Assistant to the Village Administrator Justyn Miller for their continued fiscal responsibility while adhering to the budget passed by the Board of Trustees and continuing to provide our residents with the quality services that we all expect. The last three months of our fiscal year (February, March and April) included the beginning of the economic downturn as a result of the Coronavirus. The challenges will certainly be greater during our current fiscal year of 2020-2021 which, of course, is surrounded by the virus and all of the economic challenges that have been created by this crisis. The Village Board of Trustees and management team stands committed to our main responsibilities of providing for the public safety of the community while also being fiscally responsible with your tax dollars.

BERKELEY CONNECTS

Before we discuss what is coming for 2021, I would like to invite you and your family to visit Berkeley Park during the month of December to enjoy our holiday festival of lights. The Berkeley Public Works Department, aided by Trustee Rusty Grenier and the Berkeley Park District, are teaming up to transform Berkeley Park during the holiday season to offer a destination of traditional holiday magic. Please enjoy at your leisure throughout the month of December and early January. Our goal is to improve upon our holiday magic with each passing season at Berkeley Park for the enjoyment of all. The official Christmas tree lighting will occur on Tuesday December 1st, at 6:00 pm, prior to the Village board meeting to be held at 6:30 pm. We will not have our typical Holiday Fest due to the increase of Coronavirus, but please join us on the Village's Facebook page, as we will livestream for your convenience.

The Berkeley Youth Baseball Association (BYBA) is the longest running continuous youth program in the 98-year history of Berkeley. For over 65 years, some 10,000 young boys and girls have participated in the BYBA program with most games being played at the ballfields located behind Sunnyside School at St Charles and Wolf Roads. In 2021, BYBA will mark the final opening day of baseball at this location due to the construction of the new District 87 School buildings scheduled to break ground in May of 2021. The new "State of the Art" school buildings are to be built where so many Berkeley youths learned and enjoyed Little League Baseball. This is great news for the future of our educational system in Berkeley District 87 and represents an opportunity for BYBA as well. The Village of Berkeley and the Village of Hillside are currently planning a combined Youth Baseball Program in order to continue to provide the opportunities for our youngsters to participate in a quality baseball program with games to be played at the Hillside Commons and also Berkeley Park on Electric Avenue. The Village of Berkeley owes a debt of gratitude to District 87, thousands of players, coaches, parents, sponsors and all who contributed to the success of BYBA for all of these years. A special opening day ceremony will take place in April 2021 to acknowledge the success of this program and celebrate its future partnership many years to come.

By now, you are likely aware of the I-294 expansion project currently taking place from 95th St. to the south to Balmoral Ave. to the north. The Village of Berkeley is and will be greatly impacted by this massive road project that cuts along our western border. Six homes have been purchased from their owners and demolished, two 230' tall electrical towers are now located right at our border for relocated electrical lines, one of our public works storage yards is being relocated as well as other impacts on our community that involve the revenue stream that the Village routinely receives from a billboard and cell towers located on Berkeley property.

The impact on Berkeley comes at a cost, yet it is a cost that the Toll Authority has assured us will make the Village financially "whole" while improving the I-294 Tollway for years to come. There are some complex issues at stake within the negotiation process that involve many partners, both public and private, as well as lease agreements, land acquisitions, terms and conditions. I say this to assure the residents that we, as your representative to the public safety and welfare of our community, are committed to holding the Toll Authority to their word and commitment of honoring the partnership that this project entails. The Berkeley Board of Trustees and management staff has fulfilled every obligation to the Toll Authority and fully expects the same in return from them as we move toward completion of our negotiations.

In conclusion, I would like to wish you all a safe, happy and healthy holiday season. Thank you for making Berkeley your home. 2021 will be a terrific year for Berkeley!!!!!!!

As winter approaches the thought of snow and ice is inevitable. Let's keep in mind the following:

- In order for the Village to plow the streets effectively and efficiently, vehicles must not park on the Village Street when there is a potential of two (2) or more inches of snow, keep your garbage and recycling containers off of the streets so that the trucks can effectively remove the snow, keep the sidewalks shoveled and remember to not throw snow into the street.
- Avoiding accidents is always a priority. Sump-pump discharges are not allowed to discharge onto public property
 or cause a nuisance to a neighbor. Discharge should be maintained at least five (5) feet from any lot line. In cold
 months, discharging on to public sidewalks or the street will cause ice and the potential for accidents and injuries.
- As always, with extreme weather remember to check on children, the elderly and pets who are outdoors for long periods of time.

Winter Fire Safety Tips



As the temperatures drop the Berkeley Fire Department wants to take this opportunity to pass along some winter safety tips. The following facts are eye opening:

- Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January, and February.
- 1 in 7 home fires are related to heating equipment.
- 1 in 5 home fire deaths are because of heating equipment.
- Move any combustible materials a minimum of 3 feet away from heating devices. This includes fireplaces, wood stoves, furnaces, hot water heaters and of course space heaters.
- In the event of a power loss make sure to keep all portable generators outside and away from windows, doorways, the attached garage or any place else that will allow fumes and carbon monoxide to drift into the home.
- Your home should have a working carbon monoxide detector on every level and test them at least once a month.
- When using an electrical space heater make sure it is the only item plugged into that outlet never overload an outlet this is a major electrical hazard.
- A yearly inspection and cleaning of your fire place chimney and firebox should be done. Always store cooled ashes outside the home in a metal container. This metal container should be off decks, porches and not in the garage.
- Please be aware of where you shovel or blow your snow. <u>Do not cover the fire hydrants.</u> If one is buried please attempt to clear it, this is a great help.

Coronavirus Safety Tips and Precautions

STAY HOME SAVE LIVES Help stop coronavirus

STAY home as much as you can

KEEP a safe distance **WASH** hands often **COVER** your cough **SICK?** Call ahead



The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. Learn how COVID-19 spreads and practice these actions to help prevent the spread of this illness.

To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, everyone should:

- Clean your hands often, either with soap and water for 20 seconds or a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay at home as much as possible.
- Put distance between yourself and other people (at least 6 feet).
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces daily.
